Course Description

CRIT 201 Back to the Future: Nostalgia in Pop Culture

From consumer products such as the re-released Polaroid Instant Camera to Super Mario video games, Lindy Hop dance competitions, or Hollywood movies such as *The Shape of Water* or Netflix's *Stranger Things* – nostalgia is a pervasive part of our contemporary moment in popular culture. Apart from expressing a sentimental longing and yearning for the return of an idealized and "mythical past" (Boym), nostalgia is also a powerful marketing tool. In this class, students will explore nostalgia in popular culture by examining relevant cultural texts, practices, and artefacts and their underlying economic and ideological implications.
